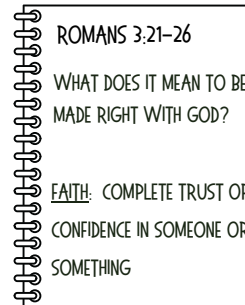

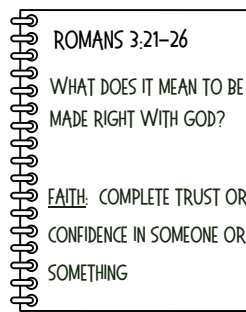
TIPS FOR USING THIS BIBLE READING SCHEDULE:

* Make reading the Bible a special time: purposefully set aside 10 quiet minutes, grab a cup of something yummy or a couple cookies, use special pens, etc.

* Get your child a special notebook (or a **Digging Into God** journal) that they can use to keep track of what they are reading. Encourage them to:

* To begin with, read the daily reading together. Show them how to find the book of Romans, the chapter, and the verse. Talk about what you read, ask if they have any questions. After a week or two, have them read on their own and share about what they learned afterwards.

* If you don't read every single day, don't worry about it! That's why the list is undated. The purpose is to teach your children how to read and understand the Bible--not to check off all the boxes.

* After your child finishes one of the sections of Romans, take them out for a special treat or outing (a donut, a milkshake, a trip to the park). Bring their Bible and notebook with you so you can discuss what they learned. Planting the Word of God in their hearts is a good thing to reward!
