JESUS: 7 "I AM" STATEMENTS

To the Israelites, "I AM" is understood as a name for God. When Jesus made an "I am" statement, He was identifying Himself as God, and describing His attributes.

In the Book of John in the Bible, Jesus makes 7 "I am" statements about himself. In these statements, Jesus uses metaphors to describe, and **help us understand, who he is and what he does.**

A metaphor is a creative way to compare two things that are different, but share some similarities. Instead of saying something like: 'I ran fast on the track.', a more memorable and vivid thing to say would be: 'I was a lightning bolt on the track!' You aren't really a lightning bolt, but both you and a lightning bolt are very fast.

When using a metaphor, we say that one thing is another thing, even though they are different. When Jesus claims he is the 'bread of life', he's not actually saying he's a loaf of bread. But, eating bread (food) gives us physical life, and Jesus, the bread of life, gives us eternal life.

When you read these "I am" statements, look for the hidden meaning in the picture Jesus is using to reveal more of His identity. He loves you and wants you to know and understand who He is, who you are, and how you can be close to Him.

Parents: Since Jesus is using symbolic language in these statements, it is important to understand the context in which He is speaking. If possible, **read the passage with your child before he does the copywork.**



In the Old Testament (the time period before Jesus came to earth as a man), God revealed His name to Moses:



Why did Jesus compare himself to light?






